3. **Player-Centric Approach:** Focus on the well-being, development, and safety of players. Their growth as cricketers and individuals is our ultimate goal.
4. **Respect for Umpires:** Refrain from arguing with umpires during matches. Address concerns through appropriate channels, maintaining respect for their decisions.
5. **Positive Communication:** Foster open dialogue with players. Provide constructive feedback and motivate them to improve.
6. **Fair Play and Sportsmanship:** Instil the spirit of cricket. Uphold fair play, discourage sledging, and promote respect for opponents.
7. **Skill Development and Inclusion:** Tailor coaching methods to individual needs. Ensure equal opportunities for all players, regardless of skill level.
