



Friday Night Cricket: Parent & Child Code of Conduct

For Junior Infants – 2nd Class (U8s) and their Parents/Guardians

To ensure a safe and fun environment for everyone, all members and guests must follow this Code of Conduct. Please note that failure to comply with these club rules may result in being asked to leave the grounds (trespassing) or further disciplinary action.

For Parents & Guardians

Alcohol Policy: Strictly no outside alcohol may be brought onto the club grounds. This is a vital part of our licensing agreement and insurance. Please support the club by utilizing the Club Bar on the premises for all alcoholic beverages.

Supervision: Children must not be left unattended. A parent or guardian must remain on-site at all times in case of emergency or if your child needs assistance. It is your responsibility to be fully attentive and available inclusive of FNC sessions.

Punctuality: Ensure your child arrives on time for the start of their session.

Kit & Clothing: Children should wear their CCC season T-shirt and weather-appropriate clothing. If your child does not have their T-shirt, please see a Lead Volunteer or Coach for a wristband.

Safety & Health: Please inform the Club of any medical conditions or specific needs that may affect your child's safety or participation.

Positive Environment: Support a positive atmosphere. Disruptive behaviour affects the experience for all children and will not be tolerated.

Respect: Treat all coaches, volunteers, and fellow parents with respect. Show care for the CCC grounds by putting litter in the bins and keeping the facilities tidy.

Guests: If you bring friends or family, you are responsible for ensuring they understand and follow this Code of Conduct.

Under-18s Policy: To ensure a safe environment during peak hours, any person under 18 found on the grounds without adult supervision between 6:00 pm and 9:00 pm will be asked to leave.

Grievances: If you have a concern, please speak with the Lead Volunteer on the night. If the issue remains unresolved, they will provide contact details for the Friday Night Cricket Coordinator or the Chair of Youth Cricket.

For Children & Players

Listen: Try your best, stay positive, and listen carefully to your coaches and follow their instructions right away.

Kindness First: Treat every child with respect regardless of their ability or background. Bullying, teasing, name-calling, or bad language is never allowed.

Safety: Never leave the pitch without your coach's permission, and never leave the club grounds without your trusted adult.

Behave Well: Play responsibly—poor or dangerous behaviour is not permitted, otherwise your child will be removed.

The Main Goal: Have fun, make friends, and enjoy your cricket.
